Ongoing presentation of the Reenactment. A Reconstruction for the Past project

Opening: October 7th 2016, 7:00 PM Artists: Cristian Rusu & Şerban Savu

The current exhibition will open in two successive episodes. The first stage will be a performance-presentation of the *Reenactment*. A *Reconstruction for the Past* project, developed by artists Cristian Rusu and Şerban Savu. The second episode marks the final stage of *The Factory of Facts and Other (Unspoken) Stories* curatorial research, undertaken by art historian Alina Şerban and exhibited in an initial formula at Salonul de Proiecte Bucharest (21 September – 30 October 2016).

The reconstitution of the mosaic at the Steagul Rosu (Red Flag) Factory in Brasov as a mural painting was the starting point for a partnership between artists Cristian Rusu and Serban Savu. In March 2016, at the Plan B Gallery in Berlin, Şerban Savu painted the image of the mosaic which adorned the outer wall of the most iconic factory in Braşov until recently, using the technique of mural painting and preserving the character of the original work. This first gesture, Reenactment. A Fresco for the Future, discussed recent history and the various ways it is being integrated or, conversely, excluded from public discourse. Savu offers the public not only a restoration of stylistic reference points and specific subjects approached in a by-gone age, but also a collective history of public space and of the ideological context at the end of the '70s. In the next episode, Reenactment. A Ruin for the Present, Cristian Rusu demolished the wall painted by Savu, and each piece of the mural was preserved in ziplock bags, as souvenirs recalling a historical ruin. Finally, the third stage of the project aims to reconstruct the wall painted by Serban Savu by reassembling the zip-lock preserved pieces, and transporting them to Clui. Starting on the 7th of October, within the Domino space, the performingreconstruction of the destroyed work will be exhibited, and the audience will take part in this final gesture in real time, as an image removed from the public discourse will be made visible again -Reenactment. A Reconstruction for the Past.

Exhibition opening: October 28th 2016, 7:00 PM

Artists: Răzvan Anton & Miklósi Dénes, Cristian Rusu & Serban Savu, Mihai Sovăială

Alongside the performing and questioning gesture proposed by artists Cristian Rusu & Şerban Savu, the exhibition will host a series of two new projects conceived by Răzvan Anton & Miklósi Dénes, and by young artist Mihai Şovăială. Observing spacial models of social cohesion, working relationships or collective activity spaces, the artists transcribe and reflect on certain sequences and actions, images and memories which complement abstract frames of the urban landscape (defined by grids, economic and ideological indexes etc.). Beyond specific histories, beyond the social success and/or failure of urban and industrial area planning in '60-'80s Romania, the works interrogate the mental barriers of a purely subjective space, where the point of balance leans toward an acknowledgement of living, human experience. The language employed is

almost documentary and archival in nature, and invites us to observe the current spacial practices and to reflect on a collective mental pattern, marked by the tension between social representation of space, and the individual experience of using and investing emotion within the space, of negotiating personal histories, public space realities and gaining or losing common significance.
